Giving Tree


Purchase an engraved leaf to support the Seneca Falls Library



The Children's Book Festival was a fun event for all! Special thanks to the Friends of the Seneca Falls Library who donated gift baskets and helped to make this event possible!




Author Jarrett Krosoczka discusses the process of writing and illustrating books.


