Computer Training

In this day and age when having computer skills is a must, where do you go to learn the basics? The Seneca Falls Library offers help to those who need assistance in becoming computer literate.



Classes

A variety of computer and technology classes are offered throughout the year to those whose skills range from the absolute beginner to serving those with moderate skill levels. Topics include learning computer basics to introductory courses on computer programs such as Microsoft Word (typewritten documents), PowerPoint (slide shows) and Excel (spreadsheets).



Instructional Videos

Websites such as YouTube have millions of instructional videos to teach computer programs to people at all skill levels. Our circulation staff is always happy to help our patrons gain access to the internet on public computers.

Teen Tech Tutor

For those who have specialized questions such as "How do I take a photo with my smartphone?" or "How do I change the volume on my tablet?" they can drop by the Library on Thursday evenings from 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM for 1-on-1 help. Techsavvy teenagers are available to answer common questions and to provide personal assistance.
