For the Love of Books

Developing a Library Collection

Have you ever wondered how a library



decides on what books to add to its collection? With a limited amount of space and millions of books to choose from, it can seem

daunting to determine which books should be added and when it is time for others to go to another home.

The Seneca Falls Library began collecting books in the late 19th century. As the collection grew, it was moved several times before receiving a long-term home at 31 Fall Street, where it was housed from 1904 to 2003. The collection was relocated to its present location at 47 Cayuga Street in November 2003.

Through the years, books have come and gone, reflecting changing times and shifting needs of library patrons. The decision on what books remain on the Library's shelves falls primarily on the Library's Director, Jenny Burnett, who says, "I want people to use the Library, not just look at it." Her philosophy is to make sure that the Library has books that are being checked out regularly and not just sitting on the shelves.

Adding books to the collection

When deciding to add books to the Library collection, Ms. Burnett asks herself some basic questions. How many copies are in the Finger Lakes Library System? Is that work well reviewed? Is it new and timely? Is it an authority title (a standard or classic in its field)? Do we have several similar books or on the same topic already in the collection or is it a topic that is lacking? Will it add balance the collection? How much will the book cost?

One way in which the Library acquires new books is through standing orders. Some authors are so popular that we know there will be a demand for their work. The Library has standing orders with booksellers that ensure that the Library will automatically receive the most famous writers' work immediately upon release.

The residents of Seneca Falls often desire the same popular books that are trending throughout the U.S. Ms. Burnett says that she keeps up with what is popular by looking at trade magazines such as Publishers Weekly and Booklist. These help her stay up-to-date on what might be of interest to our patrons.

Some decisions on what is purchased are based on patron requests. When someone wants a book to be purchased by the Library they can make a request by speaking to the Circulation Desk staff. Ms. Burnett reviews the request and decides if it is a good fit with the Library and may be of interest to others.

Does the Library ever part with books?

We love books. We want our books to have a long and loved life. But if they are in very poor condition or no longer being checked out then it may be time to remove them from the collection. Books removed from the collection are sold at the Friends of the Library book sales in the spring and fall to get a second life in a private collection. Books left over after the sale are either donated to another local nonprofit or go to Better World Books, who supports literacy around the world.

The oldest book in the collection is The Documentary History of the State of New York, Vol. 1 by E. B. O'Callaghan from 1849.



Ms. Burnett says that she asks herself several questions when deciding whether a book should be removed. How much has it been circulated in the last few years? How long has it been in the collection? In those years has it been checked out often or rarely? Is it a classic in its field? What kind of condition is it in? How many copies are available in the Finger Lakes Library System?

Code Camp


Monday, Aug. 5 thru Thursday, Aug. 8 10:30 AM - 11:30 AM
