



Beyond the library walls

Outreach Programming

People visit the Seneca Falls Library every day to check out books, to attend programs or to take advantage of any one of the dozens of free services available to them. But what about the people who never step foot in the building? How are they benefitting from the library?



Our staff has long been interested in going into the community to serve local residents. We would like every person in Seneca Falls to have access to what the library has to offer. Therefore the Seneca Falls Library has several services that take place beyond the library walls.

BookMobile

One of the best known outreach services offered is the Seneca Falls Library BookMobile. The BookMobile is active in July and August when children are on summer break from school. By providing access to books through summer vacation, kids are more likely to improve their reading skills, plus their minds are kept active thereby neutralizing summer learning loss. The BookMobile stops in two locations: Elizabeth Cady Stanton School and Hunters Run Townhomes. The BookMobile collection is kept current with new and popular titles to entice kids to check out these fun and engaging materials.



Seneca Nursing and Rehabilitation Center

Each month Circulation Supervisor, Suzanne Mathewson brings novels, DVDs and other materials to the residents of the Seneca Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Waterloo. While there, Suzanne goes room-to-room delivering items to be checked out and taking requests for the following month. Residents of the facility are often excited about both the books and the visit.

Open Houses

We love to be invited to open houses! Why? Because they are a great way to get the word out about library services. Staff attend annual open houses at Romulus Central School District and Finger Lakes Chiropractic College. There we issue library cards, encourage students to use the library's digital services, and distribute promotional materials showcasing upcoming programs of interest. We also visit the Seneca Falls Fire department and Seneca Farmer's Market for special off-site library card registration opportunities.



Elizabeth Cady Stanton School

At the Library we often see familiar faces at our various programs. We love our repeat participants! But how about those children who never visit the library? Youth Services Coordinator, Tara Montoney likes to bring library programming to schools to show kids how much fun library programs can be! In the spring of 2019, Tara provided abbreviated versions of Literary Legos, Cook-A-Book and Reading with Miss Martha to 3rd to 5th grade students. Children who normally do not attend library events participated in this after-school series. These outreach programs were underwritten by a grant from United Way of Seneca County.

Story Walk

Each summer and fall, the Seneca Falls Library partners with the Seneca

Falls Recreation Department to host a Story Walk in the Jerry Galusha (AKA Kid's Territory) playground. Laminated pages of a storybook are posted around the playground. Visitors to the playground are encouraged to walk from one post to the next and read the book in its entirety. The Story Walk motivates families to spend



time together doing a fun and active activity. A similar program, 'Stories in the Park' is an outdoor story and play time that also takes place at the Jerry Galusha playground in May and June.

We are always considering other off-site programming to reach out to the underserved in our community. By taking materials, programs and services beyond the library walls, we are able to reach a segment of the community that would otherwise not benefit from what the library offers!




