Seneca Falls Library Planned Giving

Plan for your future to include the library's future.

Last year an anonymous donor who never thought of himself as the kind of person who could leave a quarter of a million dollars to a charity, did.

With an income in the medium range, he said, "I didn't think I had the ability to make any kind of a dent. I had heard of rich people donating all the time, setting up trusts, but I did not think of myself in that league."

Last year, he joined that league by making a planned gift to the Seneca Falls Library. This gift to the Seneca Falls Library is expected to approach a value of \$300,000 at the time of his death. The total donation will become a family named fund within the endowment.

60 Family Funds and 44 Class Funds are now a part of the Library's Endowment Fund in perpetuity. A Family Fund can be established and added to at any time, growing the principal, which remains intact while only the interest is used in support of the library. The fund can be established to honor a person/family or to celebrate a milestone, and of course, in memoriam.

Both the family and the Seneca Falls Library are served by the gift and, as an extension, the whole community. The Seneca Falls Library is a valuable community resource providing information, enrichment, and entertainment for our community.

Plan for your future to include the library's future. Call and ask for a pamphlet on planned giving techniques. Talk to your attorney to adjust your will accordingly. A planned gift today will pay off in a significant way down the road. Our goal on this campaign is to add more planned gifts. Make yours be one of them.

Or, use the contribution form on the back to make a one-time donation to the Endowment Fund Appeal 2008. Obviously, the library wants to continue to grow endowment assets but also to insure the library's ability to continue into the future the many services and programs it offers to the community – that's what we're here for.

***War In the Blue—A Remembrance* by Les Lind** A documentary of the air war to commemorate the conclusion of World War II in the E.T.O. from training through combat-written by Les Lind a former B-17 Turret Gunner. Les was a graduate of Mynderse Academy, class of 1941. He was active in sports and was on the staff of the Mynderse Microphone as the sports editor. He professed to being the originator of the name "Mynderse Blue Devils". He was on the basketball team and starred on the golf team. Les married Maurita Purcell, class of 1943 in August 1947. Recently deceased, he is interned in Arlington National Cemetery. His book has been donated to the library by Mrs. Maurita Lind.

"Graphic Novels are In!"

The library's expanded collection of graphic novels – written and illustrated in comic book-style panels – were unveiled first week of July. Members of the library's teen book club introduced the collection during a brief ceremony. Snacks and graphic novel trivia games followed.

Dozens of graphic novels, the fastest growing genre in the book world, were purchased through grants from the Friends of the Seneca Falls Library group and the Finger Lakes Library Service. Graphic novels are published for all age levels and are especially popular with teens. The teens have a new corner this year just for them and the graphic novels fit right in with their posters and books.
