


## **BOOK LAUNCH**

Violinist Ellen Kogut began her studies with Muriel Bodley and Nancy Fennessy in 1994. She holds bachelors' degrees in linguistics and music from McGill University and Ithaca College, respectively. At Ithaca College, Ellen studied with Susan Waterbury and held principle and associate principle positions in the Chamber and Symphony Orchestras. An avid chamber musician, Ellen recently participated in the Adriatic Chamber Music Festival in Bonefro, Italy, and the Tuckamore Young Artists Program in St. John's, Newfoundland. She has performed in masterclasses for Arnold Steinhardt, John Lindsey, and others.

Ellen completed her Suzuki teacher training under the supervision of Sanford Reuning at the Ithaca Talent Education school. She has been a faculty member at St. Peter's Community Arts Academy in Geneva, N.Y. since 2007, and she performs frequently around the Finger Lakes Region."

Changhee has been playing the piano for more than eight years. He is currently studying with Dr. Douglas Humphreys at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY. He has accompanied choirs and studio group classes in the Geneva area, and has performed in master classes and recitals. He has performed solo recitals at St. Peter's Church, Geneva Free Library and also in piano competitions. We welcome him back after his wonderful Valentine concert here at the library.

#### Red Tent Book Club Celebrates 10!

The Red Tent Book Club, a group of women which meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Seneca Falls Library, is celebrating 10 years of reading and discussing the books they have read as a collective.

Covering many genres and more topics, the club has discovered they have livelier discussions when they don't all agree on a book. About 90 per cent of these discussions have taken place in the Seneca Falls Library meeting room, one or two a year elsewhere.

To celebrate their anniversary, they will re-read and discuss *The Reader* at their September meeting. It is the first book they read. This discussion will take place at the home of Ginny DeJohn, a founding member.

At the rate of one book per month they stand at 120 books. A copy of each of their books is on the bookshelf across from the circulation desk in the library, ready to be borrowed.

The name of the club is derived from a book read by the group, "The Red Tent" by Anita Diamant, a novel based on the life of Dinah, daughter of Jacob (Old Testament), where the women supported each other in small ways and large. The book club reads a book the month before and discusses it at the meeting. Although the group has been together for 10 years and they are always open to new members and visitors.

Red Tent is available to all those women who are interested. The books are selected by the group on a quarterly basis and planned out well in advance. The October book is the *Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao*. Visitors and new members are welcome!

#### Writer Workshops

The library is hosting Writer Workshops in the fall. It begins Sept. 15 with a kickoff talk about the Book Arts Center at Wells College by Dr. Nancy Gil, the director of the center. This discussion will focus on what happens at the center, which is fascinating. Currently featured as a minor, the school has applied to increase that designation to a major.

Three writing classes begin on Sept. 17 with Freeing the Writer Within. On Oct. 15 Journal Writing and on November 19th Memoir-Telling Your Own Story. These three are taught by Patricia Roth Schwartz, poet, writer, workshop leader.

Interspersed are Papermaking on Sept. 26 and Book Binding on Oct. 17 both taught by Heidi Egan. See the calendar. Brought to you by the Delavan Foundation!
