Seneca Falls Library Open Books—Open Minds

Dear Library Supporter,

Sixty percent of kindergarteners in low-income families in Seneca County do not have a single age-appropriate book in their homes. Difficult for many of us to imagine, this is the case for many of the children served by the Seneca Falls Library. Through people like you, our library helps low-income families and individuals every day. Services, books and programming are provided with the help of public and private contributors whose generosity helps provide a better tomorrow for those in need.

Thank you for all you do.

Reading-readiness activities, through which learners hear stories and observe that reading and writing are meaningful, are important building blocks for reading. For some children, the Seneca Falls Library is the only place they can participate in reading-readiness activities. Your membership donations help maintain children's programs and basic library operations. Due to rising costs and diminishing government support, more will be needed from you and many more donors and members to maintain the library's basic resources. In 2009 the library saw 6,679 more patron visits for a total of 43,562.

Parents of 90 % of children in poverty have low or no literacy skills.

Your support helps bring information to more families. Some face job loss or lack of reading, work, computer and parenting skills. Your generosity provides the resources and programming to help people get the skills and jobs that lead to better lives. By sharing your resources, you have also brought joy to the thousands of people who rely on the library for information, music, workshops, health information, holiday programming and children's programs.

Seneca County has a higher poverty rate than surrounding counties.

In Seneca County, 36 percent of children are eligible for free or reduced lunches. There are many needs. Won't you continue to be our partner as we work to help children and families through information, programming and other resources? At the beginning of 2010, we anticipate serving more people, including children who live in poverty. They need your help. Please give today. It will truly make a difference for all those who enter our library.

About Recorded Books:

During the holidays our connection to Recorded Books eAudio Books encountered a glitch, now fixed. Recorded Books, LLC produces and distributes unabridged eAudiobooks in downloadable formats. Over 2,600 titles are available for adults, children, and young adult. To access a book, download it and then listen to it on your MP3 player, go to our website and click on Audio Books.

For a short while the library offered downloadable movies. This offering did not work out for Recorded Books and came to an end.

Instead, the Seneca Falls Library in partnership with Transparent Language (Nashua, NH) and Recorded Books (Prince Frederick, MD), is pleased to announce the introduction of **Byki® Online Library Edition**, a powerful new online language-learning system designed specifically for use by the patrons of public libraries.

Byki, short for "Before You Know It," is a rapid learning system employing spaced interval repetition. The Byki learning method takes users through a series of simple steps to memorize words and phrases in a new language, including their meanings and proper pronunciation, in the shortest possible time.

Available for learning over 70 languages, library patrons are able to access the Byki Online system from inside or outside of the library, via the web browser on Windows and Mac computers. Click on the colorful Byki button at the bottom of our web site. Users will have a variety of high quality learning options that build listening, reading, speaking, and writing skills. In addition, Byki includes Advanced Pronunciation Analysis to help users perfect their pronunciation skills. Individual progress tracking and assessment tests help identify areas for improvement and move users in the right direction.

In addition to Byki Online's advanced learning tools, users will have access to an array of online language and cultural resources including one click access to Facebook and Twitter language communities as well as Byki language Blogs featuring a collection of articles covering the language and the culture that surrounds it. Byki Online is designed to be very low maintenance and easy to use. Details on Byki Online may be found at www.senecafallslibrary.org or at the Seneca Falls Library.
