

Seneca Falls Reads with Dr. Anna Creadick

Join your neighbors in Seneca Falls in reading *Peyton Place* by Grace Metalious and *Maud Martha* by Gwendolyn Brooks. Dr. Anna Creadick, Assistant Professor of English at Hobart and William Smith Colleges, will lead the *Peyton Place* discussion on Tuesday, February 1st at 7:00 pm. Plan to return one month later for *Maud Martha*!

Peyton Place caused quite a stir after its publication in 1956. The novel was scandalous for its time and spawned both a movie and television show, paving the way for the modern soap opera. *Maud Martha* is a lesser-known novel by a Pulitzer Prizewinning poet. This collection of 34 vignettes chronicles the life of an African-American woman coming of age in 1940s Chicago.

Dr. Creadick - who made the selections for this year's Seneca Falls Reads disussions - noted that, while both novels focus on women's lives in the mid-twentieth century and their place in the larger society, the perspectives are quite different.
