WHATS NEW AT THE LIBRARY!

We are constantly getting new books in at the library and Mike Caraher, the librarian, thought you might like to know some of the titles that have recently arrived.

Also, if we don't have a book you would like to read, please stop at the circulation desk and fill out a book suggestion card. We will definitely consider purchasing the book when we place our next order.

Juvenile Books:

<u>Sweet!: the Delicious Story of Candy</u> by Ann Love. The author looks at the ingredients in candy, how candy is made, and the history of candy from all over the world.

Moses: When Harriet Tubman Led her People to Freedom by Carole Boston Weatherford. (Caldecott Honor Book) Harriet Tubman escapes from slavery only to return to the South to lead others to freedom.

Adult Books:

A Long Way Gone: Memoirs of a Boy Soldier by Ishmael Beah. The true story of a 12-year-old boy caught up in the atrocities of the Sierra Leone civil war and his return to humanity at a rehabilitation center sponsored by UNICEF and partnering NGO's.

Burning Bright by Tracy Chevalier. The author of a <u>Girl with a Pearl Earring</u> follows the lives of the Kellaways as they move from the country to London and become a neighbor of poet and painter William Blake (1757-1827).

The Maple Syrup Book by Janet Eagleson. The book explores all aspects of maple syrup from the tree to the table.

<u>Innocent in Death</u> by J. D. Robb. New York City's top homicide cop, Lt. Eve Dallas, is called upon to solve the murder of a popular history teacher at the exclusive Sarah Child Academy.

New Videos include: Notes on a Scandal, The Last King of Scotland & Freedom Riders.

And we have <u>Books on CD</u>. New ones include: *The Good Husband of Zebra Drive* by Alexander McCall Smith, *Einstein: His Life & Universe* by Walter Isaacson & *Simple Genius* by David Baldacci.

<u>Seneca County Youth Department</u> donated money which was supplemented by the <u>Friends of the Library</u> in order to upgrade the children's old computers with two new ones.


