Karen's Tale: The Library Reading Dog Program



If you ask a child in Seneca Falls about their favorite memory of library, many will respond that they loved Martha, the long-time reading dog. Martha motivated children to read for over a decade. Now that she has passed, another dog, Trevor, is about to step into this important role with the "Tales with Trevor" motivational reading program.

How did Martha, and now Trevor, come to be such a large part of the Seneca Falls Library's programming? Much of this is due to the dedication of dogs' owner, Karen Kelley.

Karen is passionate about dogs and about motivating kids to read! For the last 10 years, she has worked with the Seneca Falls Library to help us inspire children.

Karen first started connecting kids with dogs through the Geneva Public Library. They had a reading dog and Karen thought to herself, "Martha could do that." Soon after, she and Martha started volunteering at the library in Geneva. Tara Montoney of the Seneca Falls

Library learned about Karen and Martha's work. She called and asked if Karen and Martha could come and do a program with us. "Reading with Martha" was born.

Earlier this year, "Miss Martha" passed away. Karen has grieved her loss and originally had no plans to adopt another dog. But, as providence would have it, Karen was looking at newspaper ads and one in particular popped out at her. A purebred Golden Retriever puppy was available to adopt. Karen says that Trevor's coming into her life was by "Divine Intervention". She knew that she was meant to work with dogs and children to help the kids enjoy reading. Karen stated, "Trever was sent to me for this reason."



Not all dogs are made to be Reading dogs. When asked what special qualities Trevor possesses that would make him right for the job, Karen said, "You can't train a dog to be a reading dog. Trevor is young, but is a natural." Karen says that Trevor is calm and docile, loves everybody, is sweet and likeable.

When asked how Trevor differs from Martha, Karen explained that both are somewhat similar in that both are very smart and have comparable temperaments. At 6 months old, Trevor is starting younger. Martha became a reading dog at age 3. Due to his young age, he is more energetic and kids will not be allowed to lay their heads on Trevor as they did on Martha. Whereas Martha was a rescue dog and a chow mix, Trevor is a purebred golden retriever. Also, Karen and her husband, Francis created outfits for different occasions for Martha. Trevor will not have rotating outfits because, "That was particular to Martha."

Karen is inspired by the influence her dogs have had on kids. She stated, "Kids would rather read to a dog over a person. Dogs can be a hook to get kids into the library." Beyond encouraging children to read aloud, exposing children to a calm and friendly dog has helped some young patrons to conquer their fear of dogs.



You may be wondering, what has kept Karen doing this for so long? Part of this may be due to hearing parents tell her things such as "My child didn't like to read until Martha" or watching a young child who couldn't read to sit beside Martha, open a book and start telling Martha a story based on the pictures.

We at the Seneca Falls Library are grateful for the time and dedication that Karen has shown the community through her commitment to helping kids love to read. We are looking forward to working with Karen and with Trevor for years to come.



Friday, December 3 6:00 PM






