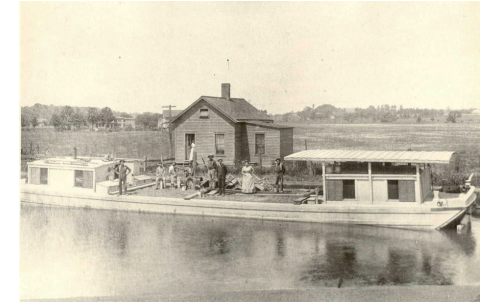
## Stuffie Adoption Begins Monday, June 22

## Waterways of Change: Women and the Erie Canal Saturday, June 27 1:00 PM



For Adults: The Erie Canal revolutionized Upstate New York, bringing new ideas, people, and industries to the region, sparking a firestorm of change.
